The Hadrian's Wall




- Great Britain's oldest landmark
- since 1987 part of the UNESCO
- today one of the best footpaths in Great Britain
- The "Hadrians Wall Path/ National Trail" makes a wonderful view from the Northsea to the Atlantic possible




- The Hadrian's Wall is 113-117 km long and goes through Northern England
- It is 2,5-3m wide and reaches a weight until 5 metres
- The wall had many flood barriers with tower and many forts.
 There were 14 warehouses and 80 gates. The gates had an distant which was exactly one roman mile(1470-1490metres).
- The Wall was built off wood and torf or off stones.





- built by the Romans in order of the imperator Hadrian in 122 AD after Christ
- nobody knows exactly what it really stands for: Protection against the northern tribes, edge between Scotland and Northengland or trade route
