- Is the largest regimental museum of Scotland outside of Edinburgh

- Has nearly 20.000 artefacts and 10.000 documents and photographs

There you can learn a lot about the Scotland's natives and how they lived in this different society with their Clans.



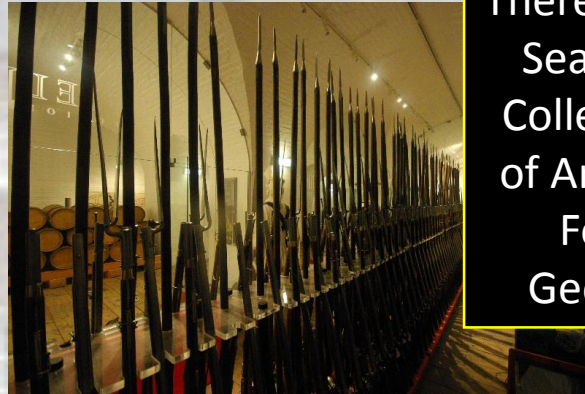
FORT GEORGE

Fortress to the north-east of Inverness

THE MUSEUM 'S COLLECTION

- 5,000 gallantry awards and campaign medals
- 16 of the Regiment's 22 Victoria Crosses
- a set of Colours carried at the Battle of Waterloo
- King Edward VIII's regimental uniform
- personal artefacts carried by members of the Regiment
- a box used by Adolf Hitler for his personal papers
