Rhossili on the Gower

Rhossili is a little rural town, located at the most Western part of the Gower Peninsula. There live only about 100 people. Nevertheless, in this area there is a lot of history. For example, a Helvetian ship from 1887 or remains of stone age men.

If the weather is well, this is the place to go, to see one of the best beaches in Wales. We can enjoy the coast and take a walk along one of Wales's most iconic cliffs or just go swimming and surfing. From the earlier cottages of the coastguard we will have a fantastic view and it is also possible to go up to Rhossili Down, a hill, and enjoy an even greater view over the landscape.



Worm's Head

Worm's Head is an island on the south-western end of the Gower peninsula, near to Rhossili. The name is because of the form of the island, which is similar to a dragon.

The special about this little island is, that this is a tidal-island and always two hours before and after the low tide Worm's Head can be reached by a 60 minutes' walk. On this way we have to go through *Devil's Hole*, a gate developed from erosion and is like to the "Prebisch gate". Finally arrived we have the chance to watch some sea dogs. Also from there we have a fantastic view to the south and western coast and to the whole Rhossili bay.
